- Ans. As the rivers flow along different kinds of rocks they carry many minerals and salts along with them down to the seas and oceans. These minerals and salts keep getting collected in the seas and oceans making them salty.

Tree that grow on the mountains are very special as they can survive in the snow.

- 3. The water in the oceans evaporates due to the Sun's heat to form vapour. The water vapour rises and changes into droplets of water. These droplets join together to form clouds, which bring rain.
