Ans. When Gandhiji returned to India in 1915, he joined the freedom struggle and soon became the leader of the freedom movement. The Non-Cooperation Movement (1920), the Civil Disobedience Movement (1930) And the Quit India Movement (1942) are the important non-violent movements led by Gandhiji against the British.

b. Why was Sabarmati Ashram set up?

Ans. Gandhiji led a very simple and disciplined life. He wanted to teach simple living to his followers. So he set up an ashram in Sabarmati in Gujarat.

c. What is written at the bottom of the National Emblem? What does it signify?

Ans. The National Emblem is taken from the Ashoka Pillar at Sarnath. At the bottom the word Satyameva Jayate is written in Sanskrit, which means "Truth alone triumphs." The emblem signifies power, courage and confidence.

d. What happened to the early humans after the discovery of farming and agriculture?

Ans. When the early men learnt farming and agriculture they started living in one place. Then they settled down in places near the river banks where they could get water for their crops. The places where they settled, developed into villages and towns.
