

Ans.: The three ranges of the Himalayas are 1. Himadri or the Greater Himalayas, 2. Himachal or the Middle or Lesser Himalayas and 3. Shiwalik or the Outer Himalayas

b. Why is the eastern coastal plains fertile?

Ans.: The eastern coastal plains are fertile because many rivers flow across these plains. The rivers Mahanadi, Godavari, Krishna, and Kaveri have formed fertile deltas on the eastern coast. Hence, due to the deltas the eastern coastal plains are fertile.

Ans.: The male deer secrets a substance called musk which is used in perfumes and medicines. This is the speciality of the musk deer.

Ans.: The red panda has a large wrist bone which helps it to grasp and tightly hold bamboo. It also has a large tail which it uses as a pillow while sleeping on the trees. The red panda is the state animal of Sikkim.

e. What is the special features of the mangrove tree?

Ans.: The mangrove trees have some of their roots above the ground (called aerial roots). These roots have pores which help the trees breathe. These trees can grow easily in the brackish or salty water which is found in the delta region.
