

It was only human beings who are not at peace. They fight among each other and rage wars destroying everything. So the poet feels sad to think of what made had turned himself into.
- c. The shoemaker's physical appearance hinted that he had been neglected for a long time. He had raggedly cut white beard, a hollow face, and exceedingly bright eyes. The hollowness and thinness of his face would have caused them to look large, under his dark eyebrows and his confused white hair. His yellow rags of shirt lay open at the throat, and showed his body to be withered and worn. He, and his old canvas frock, and his loose stockings and all his poor tatters of clothes had been in seclusion from direct light and air for a long time.
