APJ Abdul Kalam was born on 15th October,1931 in Rameshwaram, TamilNadu. He had his higher education from St. Joseph's College. He had acquired a degree in Aeronautical Engineering from Madras Institute of Technology. After completing his education he had joined Defence Research and Development Organization as a Senior Scientific Assistant in 1958. He had worked in different capacities eg. Project Director of SLVIII, Senior Scientific Advisor to India's Defence Minister in 1992. He was a key figure in May 1998 Pokhran tests. He became the President of India and brought glory to our country. He died at the age of 83.
